Conference Activities

I prepared several papers for conferences that were held during the months of June and December 2013. My papers for the CESB13 conference held in Prague in June covered two topics. The first papers was on the "Design of an Environmentally Sustainable Business and Cultural Centre for Indigenous People in Yarrabah Community, Australia". This paper examined the design of the proposed Yarrabah multi-purpose centre with respect to environmental, economic, and cultural

sustainability, with the aim of producing a building that holds both cultural significance and environmental integrity. The second paper was a "Post-Construction Review of Environmentally Sustainable Housing for Indigenous People in Nguiu Community, Australia." This paper reported the findings of a review of four houses in the remote community of Nguiu, emphasising environmental design features and performance, construction materials and methods, and cultural aspects. I also served on the scientific committee for Prague conference and reviewed several papers for submission.

A special thanks to Petr Hyjeck conference leader for the welcome back to Prague and for providing yet another successful iiSBE conference.

The second conference I attended was the SB13 Dubai conference. I presented two papers at the conference. The first paper was on 'Waste Material Recycling Facility and Sustainability in Remote Communities: An Australian Case Study. "This paper provided background on the establishment of an Material Recycling Facility in a remote aboriginal community and various factors influencing the project's success and completion. The second paper was on "Sustainable Building in Remote Communities: Insights from Australia. "In this paper I covered the construction of housing on a remote island off the coast of Australia and two commercial buildings in remote locations.





The World Construction Symposium 2013 was held in June in Colombo, Sri Lanka. Prof Chitra Weddikkara, Chairperson, asked that I serve on the Scientific Committee for the WCS 13, and I accepted that honour.

This conference focused on the issues and challenges facing the Sir Lankan people after a long war. Countries in this region face different challenges than those faced by the Western & developed countries. These challenges require a different approach from what is prevalent in the West and most conferences. Thus the papers in this conference brought a new perspective which will hopefully complete what is not addressed by other SB13 conferences.

Other Activities

Consultancy ISPT

Development of peer reviewed journal papers and presentations at international conferences on the performances of two buildings from the ISPT 70 commercial building portfolio worth some \$9.7billion

The first paper is to be presented in Gainesville, Florida on a building located at 345 George St in Sydney and it is focused on smart engineering taking a standard 30 year old building from 2.5 stars to 5.4 stars with manual expense.

The second paper is to be presented in Barcelona, Spain on a building located at 477 Pit Street in Sydney and it is focus on smart engineering as well looking at Indoor Environmental Quality bases on the NABERS IEQ rating system.
